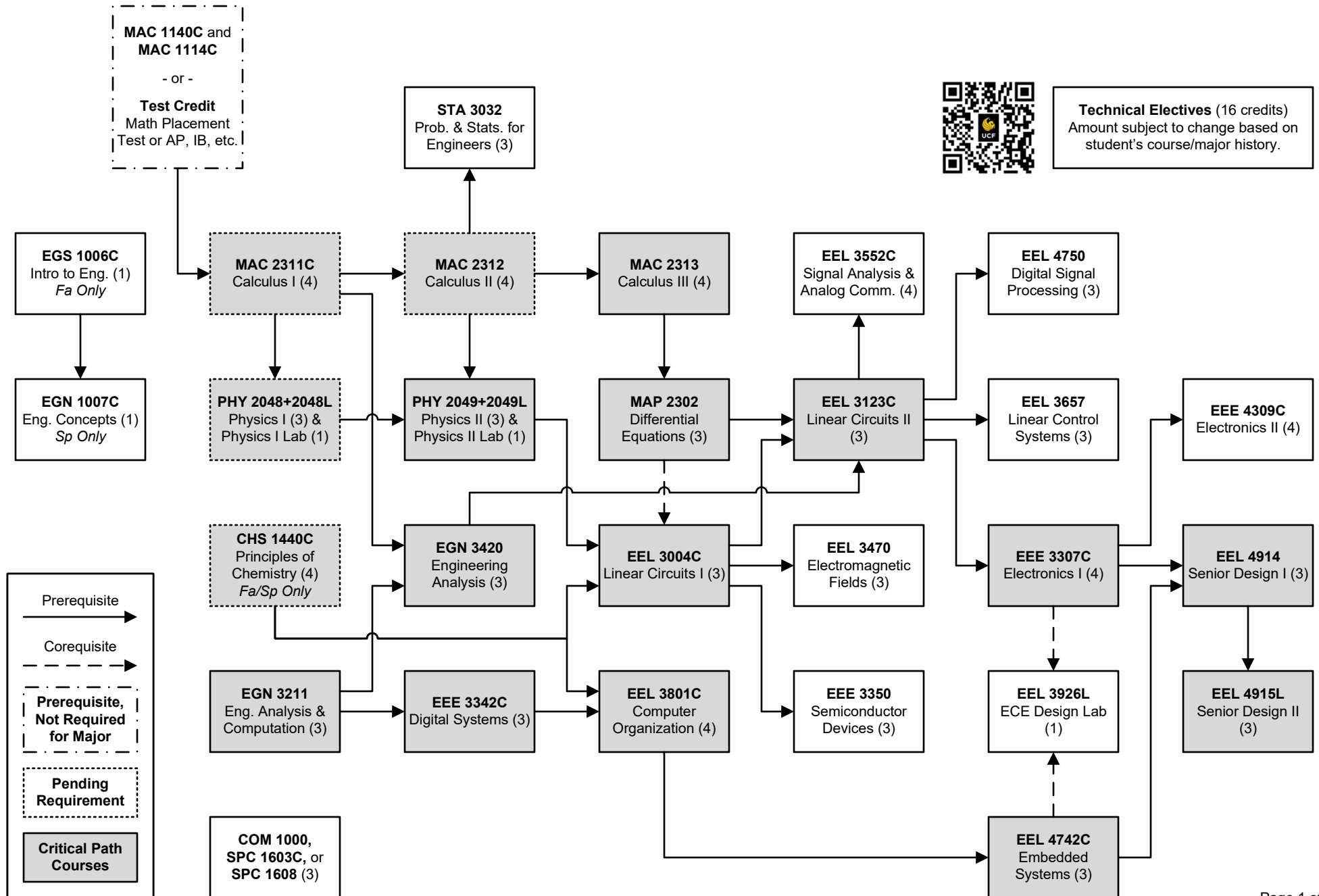

Term Offerings

Unless otherwise noted, courses are offered year-round (Fall, Spring, and Summer). Courses may not be offered in all listed terms, or may be offered outside of regularly scheduled terms.

Course Requisite Updates

When requisites for a course change, they impact all students regardless of their catalog year.

EGS 1006C and EGN 1007C

EGS 1006C and EGN 1007C are reserved and mandatory for first-time in college (FTIC) students in their first year. Students who did not take these courses during their first year in college are not eligible to enroll in these courses. Students who do not have credit for these courses will need to complete additional technical elective credits.

Senior Design Sequencing Policy

The Senior Design sequence must be taken in consecutive semesters (Fall-Spring, Spring-Summer, or Summer-Fall), with the second course in the sequence being in your graduating term.
